

History of the Flow Measurement Technical Library

In October 2007, CEESI started the “CEESI Technical Library”, which was a collection of flow measurement related documents available on the internet and free to users. The purpose of this library was to create a repository for bibliographic references and downloadable PDF files that could be used by technicians, engineers, researchers, managers, etc. Since the library was created, CEESI has worked with organizations such as the National Institute of Science and Technology (NIST), International School of Hydrocarbon Measurement, American School of Gas Measurement Training (ASGMT), American Gas Association, and the Natural Gas Sampling Technology Conference (NGSTC) to expand the number of PDF files and bibliographic references available to internet users. In winter 2007, North American Fluid Flow Measurement Council members reached an agreement with CEESI to allow users to download all ISFFM papers for free. The Pipeline Research Council International (PRCI) began to work with CEESI in 2008 to further expand and promote the library and its name was changed to the “Flow Measurement Technical Library”. As of winter 2009, over 50,000 bibliographic references and 8,000 downloadable PDF files have been added.
